### ECP Foundation Kids Fishing Derby 2015

A host of children and their parents came to try their hands. Early in the morning, a mother Mallard duck swam by with her five babies in tow, to the delight of young and old. A father walked toward me with a four-year-old boy trailing. The youngster stopped to examine a plant, pick up a stick, and point out a bird; the tyke reminded me of a puppy exploring his world.

A family arrived with three adults and five kids ages 9-12. They looked at me and asked, "Can you help us? We have never fished." I was delighted to teach them. The kids were very polite, tried very hard to grasp all the instructions. They all manage to throw their lines out; unfortunately they had little patience for the fish to bite and the fish did not cooperate very well either. The girl did catch a hand -sized blue gill. We took a look at the fish and I explained all about him to the kids.

After the third line tangle, I made them untangle the line themselves. Towards the end of the day, I said, "I am a girl and I can put a worm on; I think one of you *big guys* should put your worm on too." One young man began putting a worm on, but when the squishy stuff came out, that was all he could take.

The family was pleased, had fun and learned all about fishing.
