2023 proved to be another exciting year of growth for our organization thanks to our passionate supporters, dedicated board members, and frequent parkgoers. As we worked through a Strategic Plan, we hired a Program and Marketing Coordinator to engage members and showcase how our mission is spread throughout Eagle Creek Park every day. In 2023 we increased foundation membership to 1,749.

Our fiscal year started with the Westside Trail winning the Resource Improvement Award from the Indiana Park and Recreation Association. Thanks to a devoted committee composed of volunteers and staff from Indy Parks, ECPF, the Department of Land Stewardship, and the Department of Public Works, improvements to this trail project continued.

The good news continued to roll in when we received a phone call from The Lilly Endowment. We were awarded a \$2.6 million grant to create an ADA-accessible trail in the park near the Earth Discovery Center and a park documentary.

The year also brought sadness with the passing of Luna, the screech owl, the animal ambassador. Because the foundation has a fund reserved for animal care, we were able to provide her with the very best care while she was with us.

This year we sadly lost a retired staff member, Sam Chambers, who dedicated many years of service to our organization. Without his dedication to the park, we would not be where we are today. There is a bench on the fitness trail dedicated to Sam. When you are walking by, please take a moment to pause, breathe, and send energy to the world in his memory.

As you visit the park, you will probably notice some of our bigger funding accomplishments this year, all thanks to our donors and partnership with Indy Parks. These projects truly embody what can be achieved when people come together with common goals and shared resources to make our community better for all.
